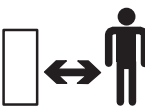

THE OPERATOR

PHYSICAL CONDITION

Operator must be in good physical condition and mental health, and not under the influence of any substance (drugs, alcohol, etc.) which might impair vision, dexterity or judgement (Fig 3).

Do not operate when fatigued. Be alert – if you get tired while operating the machine, take a break. Tiredness may result in loss of control. Working with any power tool can be strenuous. If you have any condition that might be aggravated by strenuous work, check with your doctor before operating the machine.

⚠ WARNING The unit must not be operated by minors. Bystanders, especially children and animals should not be allowed in this area where a machine is in use and be at least 15 metres (50 feet) away (Fig 4). If approached switch off motor immediately. **When not in use store out of reach of children.**

PROPER CLOTHING

Clothing must be sturdy and snug-fitting, but allow complete freedom of movement (See Fig 5). Avoid loose-fitting jackets, flared or cuffed pants, or anything that could trip the operator. Wear overalls or long pants to protect your legs. DO NOT wear shorts. Use of gloves when working is recommended.

Good footing is most important. Wear sturdy shoes with nonslip soles. DO NOT operate with bare feet. In hot or sunny conditions, always wear a hat and long sleeve shirt for protection against skin cancers. Use of a good brand of sunscreen cream is also recommended on exposed skin surfaces. Always wear ear muffs or ear plus.

⚠ WARNING Proper eye protection is a must. The covers may not protect the operator from all moving foreign objects, even though the discharge is directed away from the operator, as ricochets and bouncebacks may occur during operations. Never operate unless wearing goggles or properly fitting safety glasses with adequate front and side protection which comply with ANSI Z 87.1.

⚠ WARNING Replace immediately any worn or broken debris deflector shield, blade, cover, air inlet guard or any other damaged part. Check from time to time that all screws are tight.

SAFE WORKING INSTRUCTIONS AND IMPORTANT ADJUSTMENTS

Never operate your machine if it is damaged, improperly adjusted or not completely and securely assembled.

Use only original Atom replacement parts for maintenance and repair. Use of parts manufactured by others will void warranty and/or may cause serious or fatal injury. Electric repairs are only to be carried out by an authorised repairer.

⚠ WARNING When using Edgers & Tillers Always stop the motor, make sure that the blades have stopped, before adjusting blade height.

Follow the maintenance instructions in the appropriate section of this manual. Any motor repairs should be carried out by a person with suitable servicing experience.

SAFE STARTING AND WORKING CONDITIONS

Always inspect that the unit is in good working order before use. When working, always wrap your fingers tightly around the handle grip. Keep your hands in this position to have your machine under control at all times. NEVER attempt to operate the Atom Edger, Tiller or Drill with one hand, as a loss of control may result in serious or fatal injury. Make sure the handle grips are in good condition and free of moisture, oil or grease. Use both hands, one on each handle, to operate. Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.

⚠ WARNING The Atom unit is a one-person machine. To reduce risk of eye or other injury from thrown objects, ensure that bystanders are at least 15 metres (50 feet) away during use. Replace immediately any worn or broken parts. If approached, release throttle trigger to immediately decelerate the engine to idle.

⚠ WARNING Prolonged use of any hand-held powered machine exposing the operator to vibrations may produce whitefinger disease (Raynaud's) phenomenon or carpal tunnel syndrome. These conditions reduce the hand's ability to feel and regulate temperature, produce numbness and burning sensations, and may cause nerve and circulation damage and tissue necrosis. Extensive hours of continuous use is not recommended.

SAFE FUELING INSTRUCTIONS

⚠ WARNING Petrol is an extremely flammable and explosive fuel. Use extreme caution when handling petrol. Do not smoke or bring any fire or flame near the fuel



Refuel outdoors only. **Always switch off the engine and allow it to cool before refueling. Relieve fuel tank pressure by loosening fuel cap slowly.** Never remove fuel filler cap while engine is running.

Select bare ground for fueling, then move at least 3 metres (10 feet) from the fueling spot before starting the engine. Wipe off any spilled fuel before starting your Atom unit and check for leakage.

Always tighten fuel filler cap securely after fueling.

⚠ WARNING Always allow engine to cool before refueling. Accidental spillage of petrol over hot engine could cause fire or explosion to occur with consequent possible disfigurement or fatal injury. Wash and clean hands after fueling.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS BATTERY EDGERS & TILLERS

⚠ WARNING

Keep hands, feet away from the cutting blade (Fig 6).

SAFETY EDGERS & TILLERS

1. Avoid dangerous situations. Do not use in the presence of flammable liquids or gasses to avoid creating a fire or explosion.
2. Do not attempt to use unit if there is any damage. Do not use until damage is repaired by an authorised service centre.
3. Before doing any maintenance or repair work, or cleaning the unit or blades, adjusting wheel depth, remove battery.
4. Do not use in rain, in damp or wet locations, or around swimming pools, hot tubs, etc. Do not expose to water, rain, or snow to avoid the possibility of electrical shock.
5. Internal controller and switch (on motor). These must be replaced by an authorised service agent or similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.

CLEANING EDGER OR TILLER UNITS AFTER USE

When cleaning, remove battery and do not use water hose. Scrape dirt away. If motor accidentally wet by water, allow to dry in the sun, inspect and ensure it is dry before storing.

DO NOT USE hose water to clean machine as it can force water into casing and motor.

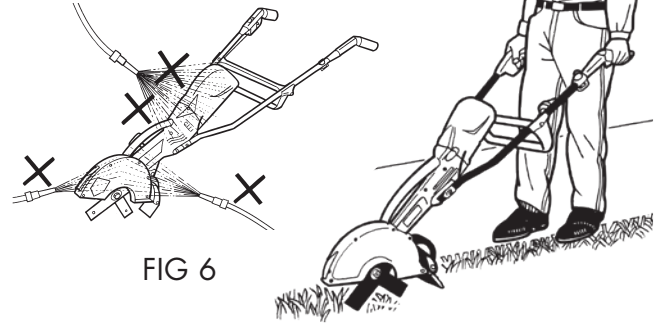

Store unit in a secure dry place indoors. Do not store unit outside.

ASSEMBLING ///ATOM® PROFESSIONAL EDGER

1. Undo 2 screws #1. See Fig. 8) Fit AV handle supports #2 & #3 by pushing fully into each side of the body #4. A soft hammer may be required. (Fig.8).
2. Re-fit screws #1 through #2 and into #3 and screw tightly. (Fig.8).
3. See page 4 Fig.10 instructions 1 & 2 for easy assembly of handles to cross brace.
4. As in Fig.7 on this page 3 and with 100mm (4") spacer block under engine, slide assembled cross brace handle tubes #5 & #6 through AV rubbers #7 & #8 into position.
5. Tighten handle knob #11 but DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN as AV becomes less effective.
6. To fit RH & LH handle grips, follow page 4 instructions 3, 4, 5 and 6.
7. Fit wheel arm as in page 4, Fig 19 instruction 8b.
8. As on this page 3, when assembled, unit will look like Fig.9.
9. Adjust edger height with wheel arm handle adjuster #21. Fig.9. Try hole 3 or 4 for first edging attempt.

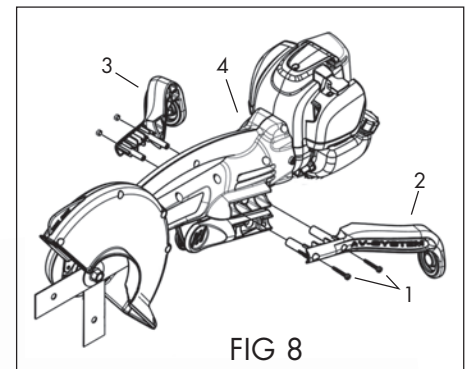

ASSEMBLING HANDLES ON LAWN EDGERS & TILLERS

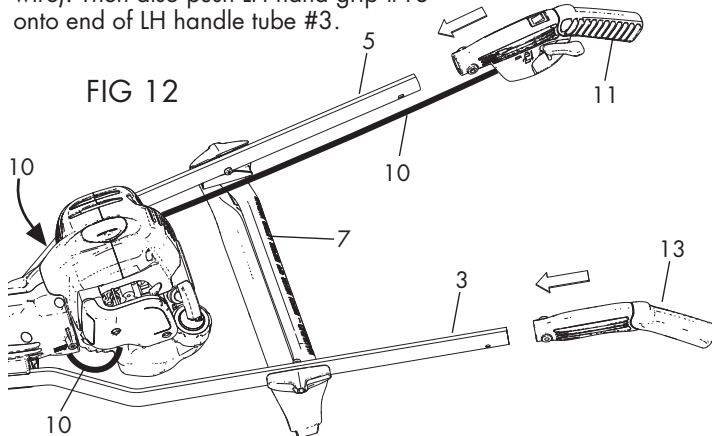
- Using blade screwdriver (or Torx-25 screwdriver). Use M5 x 36mm screws #8 to screw 2 handle tubes #3 & #5 to cross brace #7. Fig 10.



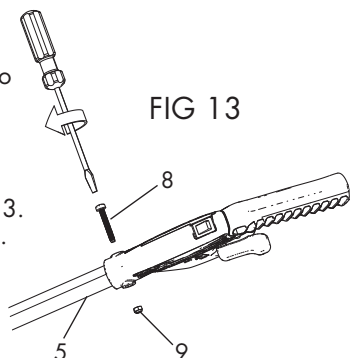
- Place lawn edger or tiller body on bench or floor **with approximately 75mm-100mm (3"-4") spacer under engine**. Fit handle tubes assembled with cross brace #7 to edger or tiller body as shown with bolt #1 and tighten large plastic wing nut #6. Fig 11. For professionals, firstly put front ends of tubes through AV rubbers #7 & #8 in Fig.7 on page 3.



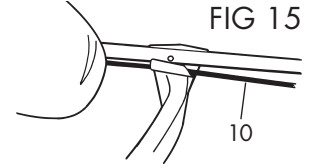
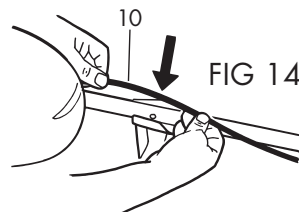
- Looking down from rear of edger or tiller, feed RH hand grip #11 with throttle trigger, throttle cable #10 and switch wire #10 under engine, and over top of cross brace #7 and push RH trigger hand grip #11 onto end of RH handle tube #5. Fig 12. (Note battery edgers/tillers have no (separate) switch wire). Then also push LH hand grip #13 onto end of LH handle tube #3.



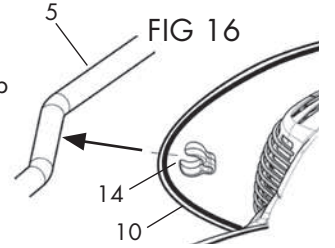
- Fit and hold M5 loc-nut #9 (with nylon part of nut facing away from tube) into hex recess of hand grip and insert M5 x 36mm #8 through hand grip (from other side), through tube and tightly screw up. Fig 13. Repeat for other hand grip.



- Clip throttle cable #10 and switch wire into place. Fig.14 and 15.



- Use cable and switch wire C-clip #14 to retain throttle cable #10 and switch wire against RH handle tube #5 adjacent engine. Fig 16.

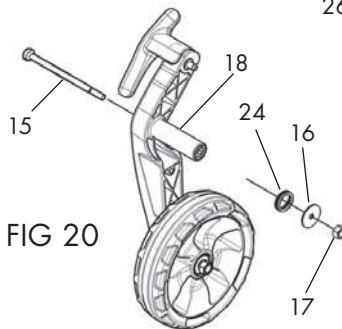
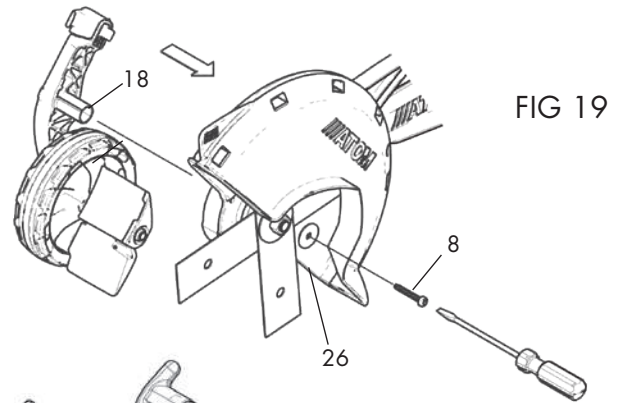


WHEEL ARM ASSEMBLY

- Fit wheel arm assembly** pivot axle #18 into RH side of main body of machine.

7(a) Wheel arm without bolt.

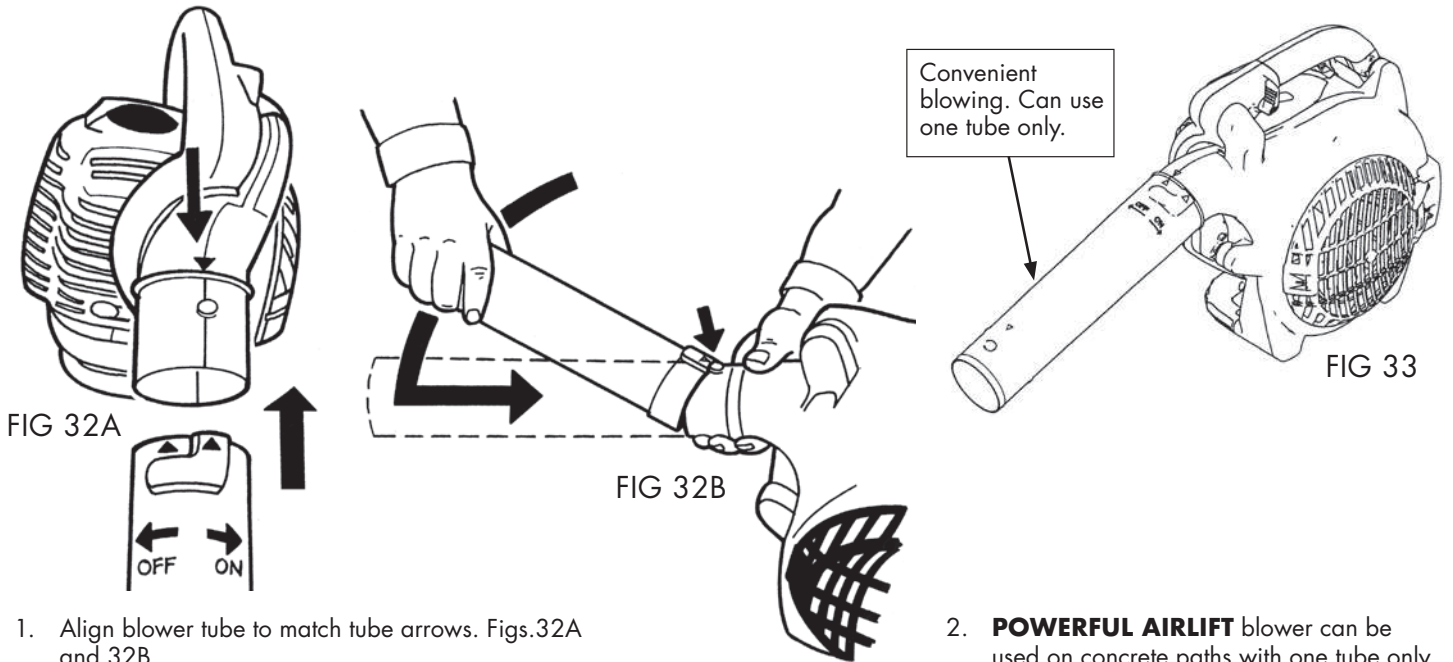
On LH side insert M5 x 36mm screw #8 through fixed encapsulated washer #26, and tighten screw. Fig.19.



- 7(b) Wheel arm with bolt.** Fig. 20. Insert bolt #15 into wheel arm, and on LH side fit o-ring #24 and washer #16 (if not already fitted) and nut #17 onto protruding bolt. **Fully tighten nut with wheel arm to be firm without sideways movement.**

ASSEMBLING ///ATOM AIRLIFT BLOWERS



1. Align blower tube to match tube arrows. Figs.32A and 32B.

With one hand squeeze casings together and push blower tube in and down. Fig.32B.

Twist blower tube clockwise to lock in position. Fig.33.

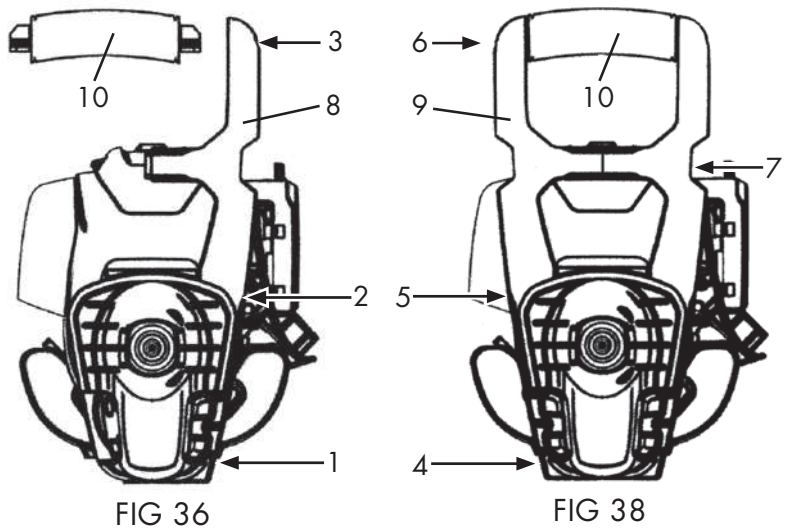
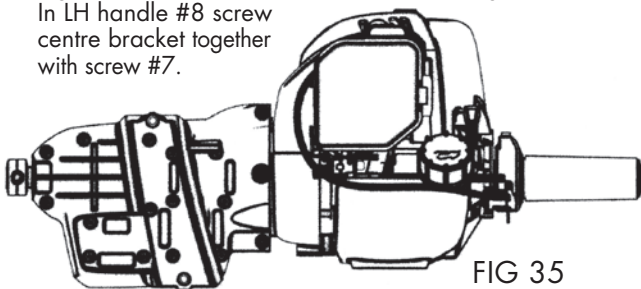
2. **POWERFUL AIRLIFT** blower can be used on concrete paths with one tube only as show in Fig 33. This is very convenient. Also convenient for storage.

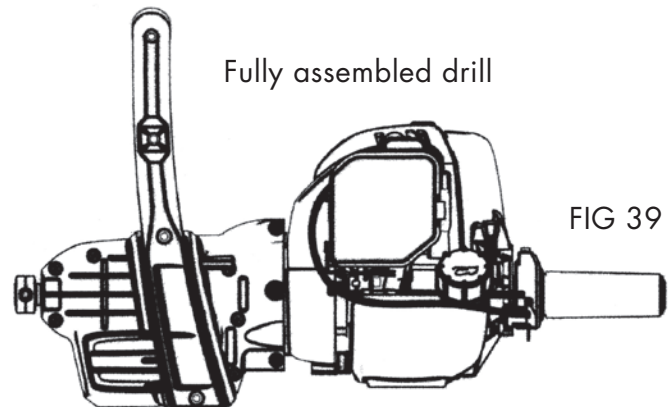
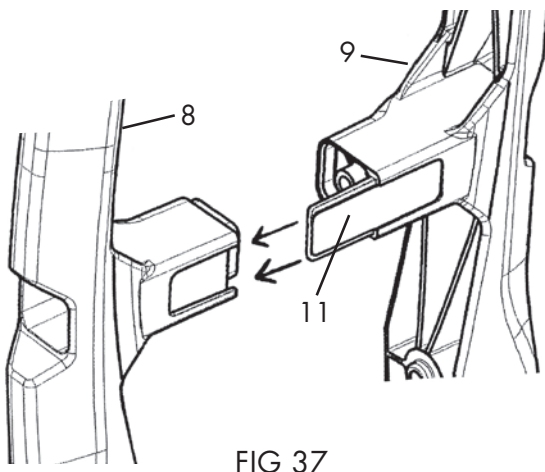
ASSEMBLING ///ATOM DRILLMASTER ENGINE DRILLS

Use Torx 25 screwdriver or straight blade screwdriver. Fit 7 screws M5 x 36mm (supplied) to assemble as follows:

1. Fig.35. Unit shown without main support handle.
2. Fig.36. Fit LH main support handle #8 into casing. Insert screws #1 and #2 and tighten. Fit handle grip #10 with screw #3 to LH support handle #8.
3. Fig.37. Carefully slide labelled Handle Rib #11 into top and bottom groove in LH handle #8.
4. Fig.38. Insert screws #4, #5 and #6 and tighten. In LH handle #8 screw centre bracket together with screw #7.



WARNING Check that all screws #1-#7 are tight.

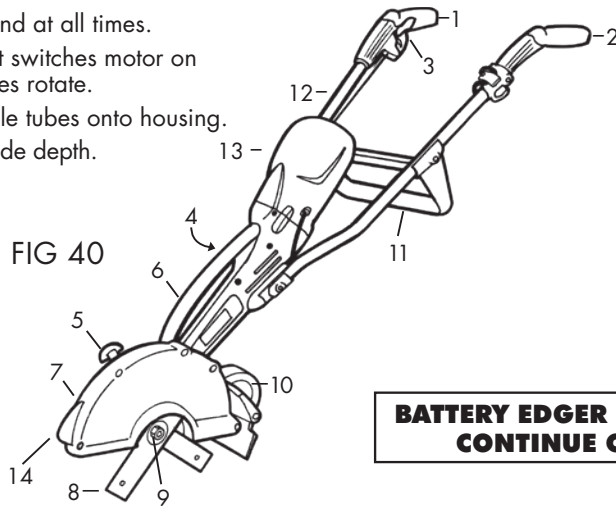

7. Blade cover reduces the risk of flying debris and direct contact with the feet or hands.
8. Blades rotate when motor is switched on.
9. Nut for holding blades (RH thread).
10. Wheel for moving and guiding edger.
11. Cross Brace, attaches downward on handle tubes.

- 1+2. Each handle grip of the Tiller are held by each hand at all times during use.
3. The throttle interlock which releases the throttle trigger which increases speed of engine for automatic safety clutch to engage and thus rotate tines.
4. RUN/STOP switch.
5. Starter grip of the pull starter which is the device to start the engine.
6. Handle wing nut for holding handle tubes onto housing.
7. Depth adjustment for adjusting wheel to regulate tine depth.
8. Tine cover reduces the risk of flying debris and direct contact with the feet or hands.
9. Handle to lift Tiller.
10. Tines rotate when engine speed is increased above idle.
- 11a. Tine holding nut RH thread (also indicated on tine cover).
- 11b. Tine holding nut LH thread (also indicated on tine cover).
12. Wheel for moving and guiding tiller.
13. Cross Brace, attaches downward on handle tubes.
14. Left and right Handle Tubes.
15. Fuel tank cap, for sealing the fuel tank filler.
16. Fuel Tank.
17. Filter housing covers the air filter element.
18. Muffler reduces exhaust noises and drives gases away from operator.
19. Spark Plug terminal cap connects the spark plug to the ignition wire (2-Stroke). On 4-Stroke Honda engine spark plug is under cylinder cover (1 screw access).
20. Warning label.
21. Fuel pump primer provides additional fuel for a cold start.
22. Lift knob to remove cover.

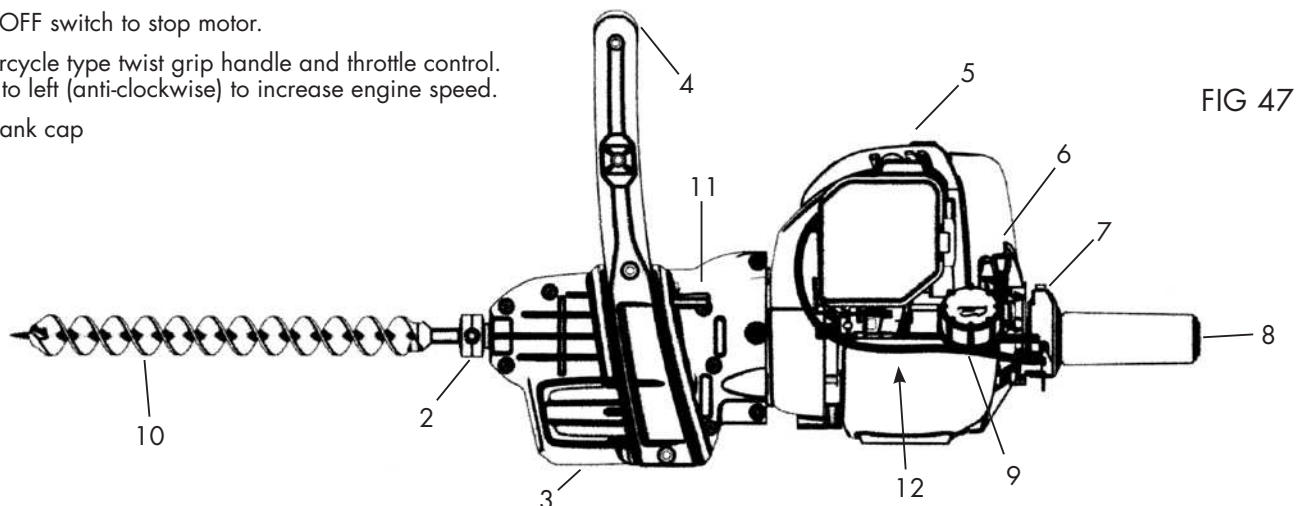

PARTS & CONTROLS: ///ATOM ENGINE DRILLS

Auger 10 shown is extra. Operator to select sizes to suit holes to be drilled.

- 2 Locking collar with grub screw to secure auger
- 3 Gear box
- 4 Gripping and carrying handle
- 5 Engine
- 6 Recoil starter – to start motor
- 7 ON/OFF switch to stop motor.
- 8 Motorcycle type twist grip handle and throttle control. Twist to left (anti-clockwise) to increase engine speed.
- 9 Fuel tank cap

- 10 Auger rotates in right hand (clockwise) direction when drilling. If drill unit is pulled back auger rotation reverses (anti clockwise) and screws out. When pressure on auger is released, auger automatically rotates in right hand (clockwise) direction.
11. Holding nest for grub screw Allen Key to lock/unlock collar and auger.
12. Carburettor primer bulb.

FUELS & OILS: ALL PETROL MODELS

⚠️ WARNING DANGER!

Fuel is extremely flammable. Handle it with care. Keep away from ignition sources. Do not smoke while fueling your equipment.

⚠️ WARNING Always allow engine to cool before refueling. Accidental spillage of petrol over a hot engine could cause fire or explosion to occur.

FUEL MIX – 2 STROKE ENGINES

IMPORTANT USE AN OIL AND PETROL MIXTURE.

Only use 50:1 specialised 2-stroke oils from lawn and garden equipment shops. Do not use outboard engine oil.

REMEMBER...

- Always mix two-cycle oil with petrol before fuelling your engine. Never, ever run your 2-stroke engine on petrol alone. This will ruin your engine and void all warranties.
- Always use a clean gas can and always use non Ethanol fuels. Ethanol (E-10) can absorb water and hence cause problems.
- Never try to mix the oil and petrol in the engine fuel tank.
- **Always mix oil and gas 50:1 in the proper proportions: 80ml of 50:1 two-cycle engine oil to 4 litres of unleaded petrol.**

! NOTE 2-Stroke engines can operate with fuel mixes from 25:1 to 50:1. We recommend 50:1, which is 1 litre of unleaded petrol to 20ml (cc) of 50:1 good quality 2-stroke oil. For 4 litres fuel add 80ml (cc) of oil. **DO NOT use 2-stroke oils that claim to use less oil (eg. 100:1).**

- Two-cycle fuel separates and ages. Do not mix more than you will use in a month. Using old fuel can cause difficult starting or engine damage. Shake fuel container to thoroughly mix fuel before each use. Do not attempt to run your 2-Stroke engine on Petrol only, this will cause engine failure and void engine warranty.

⚠️ WARNING Fill or add fuel to the tank only when the machine is in a horizontal position as typically shown for all models in Fig. 51. Allow engine to cool down for at least 5 minutes before adding fuel. Use fuel funnel (not supplied) to prevent spills. Do not spill fuel over top of tank as it will be splashed into motor air cooling system or the air filter system.

⚠️ WARNING Never store the machine with Petrol inside a building where fumes may reach an open flame or spark (e.g. gas or oil-fired heater appliance, electric motor, etc.)

Before storing for a longer period, always empty the fuel tank.

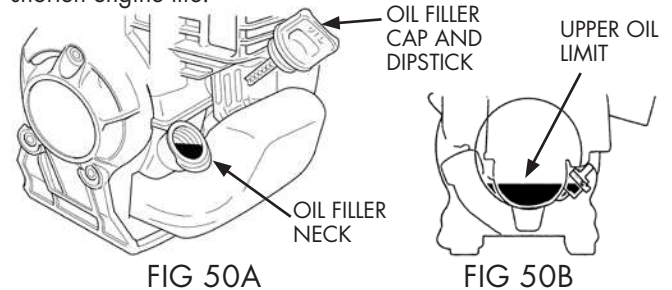
⚠️ WARNING The engine exhaust from this product contains chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.

⚠️ WARNING Pressure may build up in the canister. Remove fuel cap slowly to avoid injury from fuel spray. Replace fuel cap securely. Take care when handling Petrol. Avoid direct contact with the skin and avoid inhaling fuel vapor. Before unscrewing fuel tank cap to fuel the engine, clean the tank's cap and area around it to ensure that no dirt falls into the tank.

FUEL – 4 STROKE ENGINES

- Use clean, fresh unleaded petrol (not ethanol).
- Note:** DO NOT use 2-Stroke fuel (oil/petrol mixture).
- Use clean 4-Stroke automotive detergent oil or SAE 10-30W mineral oil. Fill crankcase to correct level.

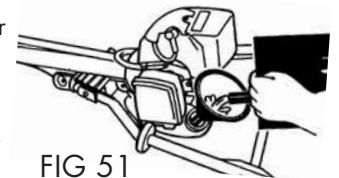
WARNING Using synthetic oil or 2 stroke oil in crankcase will shorten engine life.



- ALWAYS check your oil every first or second fuel fill. Regular check of oil levels is essential. Change oil after first 5 hours then every 30 hours. Lack of oil or infrequent change of oil will destroy engine.

⚠️ WARNING A worn or damaged muffler is a fire hazard and may cause loss of hearing. Check to see that the muffler is in good condition.

Always filter fuel when refuelling.



Check fuel filler cap for leaks at regular intervals. Use the specified spark plug and make sure it and the ignition lead are always in good condition.

⚠️ WARNING Start and operate your unit outdoors and in a ventilated area.

Keep the space behind and beside the engine clear at all times to allow for the escape of hot and toxic exhaust fumes.

Operate your machine under good visibility and daylight conditions only. Work carefully.

Never touch a hot muffler as burns will result. Store Atom product in a dry, high or locked location and out of reach of children.

GEAR LUBRICATION

EDGERS: There is sufficient lubrication to last the lifetime of the unit except for special circumstances, eg. extreme use.

TILLER GEAR BOX & ENGINE DRIVEN DRILL: Every ten hours remove filler screw and squeeze in quarter bottle grease. Page 17, Fig.84 (Tiller), and page 17, Fig.89 and Fig.90 (Drill).

STARTING & STOPPING INSTRUCTIONS: BATTERY EDGERS & TILLERS

Switch motor on by (1) pushing down safety interlock with thumb and (2) pulling on trigger. (Fig 52). To stop, release trigger.

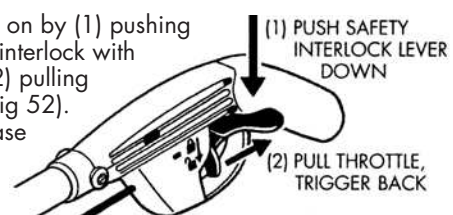

STARTING & STOPPING INSTRUCTIONS: PETROL EDGERS & TILLERS

CHOKE ON POSITION

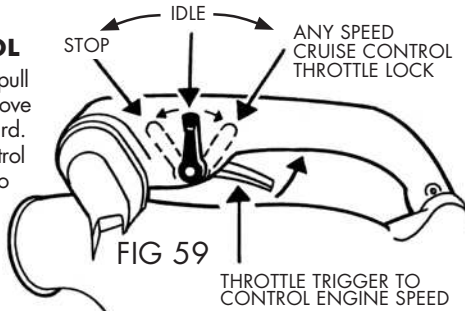

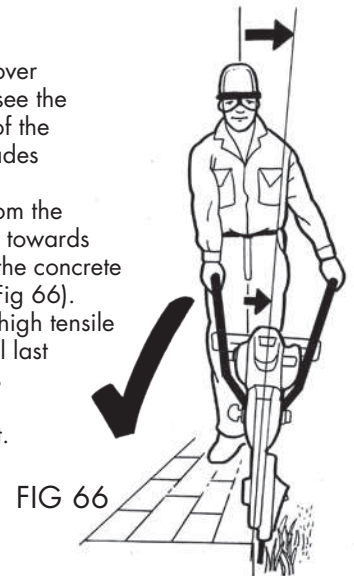

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS: TILLERS ALL MODELS

1. The Atom Tiller is very easy and simple to use. It only takes a few minutes to become an efficient user.
2. Thoroughly inspect the area where the tiller is to be used and remove all long grass, stones, sticks, wires and other foreign objects. Give the ground and little watering to soften the ground and keep dust down.

! NOTE Before tilling, grass must be cut very low to the ground (and removed) with lawnmower or string trimmer/brush cutter to prevent fine grass strands from tangling around and under tine drum.

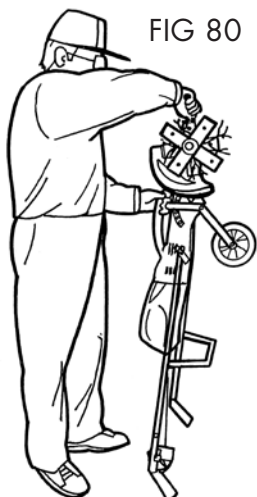
3. Adjust tine depth (Fig.70 or 71). Try the third hole closest to operator.
4. Start motor and, with both arms fully extended downwards, (Fig. 72), hold both handle grips firmly.
5. As tilling action begins, the tines dig and move the tiller forward.
6. **NOTE:** to reduce "Forward Pull" of tiller, adjust wheel arm for shallower depth.
7. Continue at a moderate pace until you are familiar with the controls and handling of the Atom Tiller.
NOTE: after allowing the tiller to cultivate 500mm you can pull it back towards you and then allow the unit to move forward again. You can repeat this procedure over the area you are cultivating. Always have a firm footing.
8. Mulching. The tiller is ideal to mix, cut lawn clippings, leaves etc into your garden bed. This method accelerates mulching/composting process.

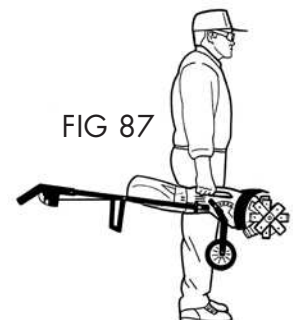
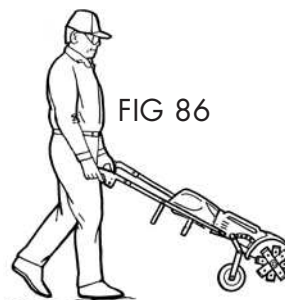


Using an Atom Tiller is a highly efficient method of creating a compost heap in the corner of your garden. This nutrient rich mulch and compost can be used to improve existing beds and stimulate rapid earth worm activity.

It only takes a few minutes to produce compost. Make a pile of leaves, lawn cuttings and other small leafy or vegetable matter, about 500mm high. Place some soil on top and spray with water. Use your Tiller to break it up into small pieces. Make the pile as big as you like.

Repeat a week later. Leave for another week and it is ready for use. You can add to the compost any time you wish.

! WARNING TO AVOID PERSONAL INJURY, NEVER CARRY THE TILLER WHILE ENGINE IS RUNNING.



The Tiller can be easily moved as shown above. Prior to lifting or carrying, stop the motor Fig.87.

! NOTE The Atom 4-Stroke blower achieves instant full power from start-up. As with all 2-Stroke blowers, the Atom 2-Stroke blowers may take several minutes of full speed running to achieve full power.

Start the motor (page 11, Fig.58) and allow to run to warm up. To stop the motor, push combination stop lever/cruise control lever forward.

To increase speed of blower, pull trigger throttle up. To lock in any speed, move cruise control lever rearwards when operating trigger throttle.

To release the "cruise control" push lever forward.

On full "cruise control" hold blower **at end of handle**, to allow nozzle to point at angle to ground without wrist twist. Shown in Fig.99A.

3. Because the Atom **AIRLIFT®** blower is so light at full throttle it can easily be held 30mm clear of operator pants **or in front of operator** (Fig. 99B). Regardless of position blower is always in comfortable smooth stable equilibrium.
4. Using the massive Atom **AIRLIFT®** air blast in this way speeds up the work to be done and saves on fuel. Atom blowers work continuously and restart easily in extremely hot weather.

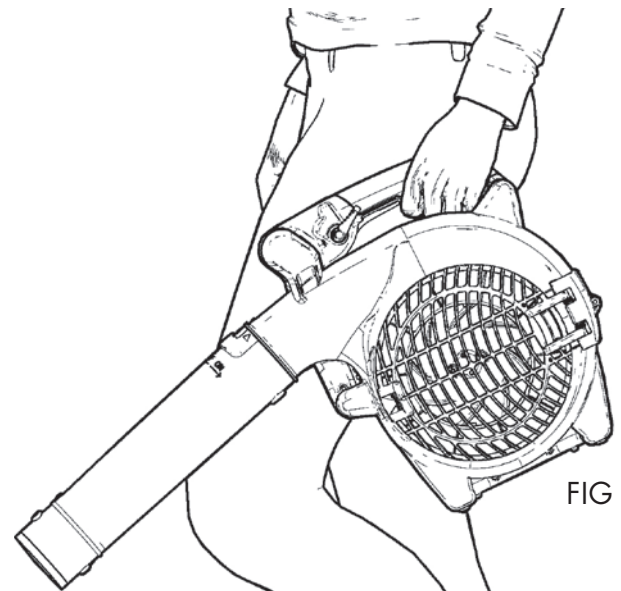

! NOTE On full "cruise control" and holding end of handle as illustrated, the 4-Stroke Model 855 **AIRLIFT®** blower in use is approximately 1Kg (2.2lbs) lighter at close to sea level altitude. 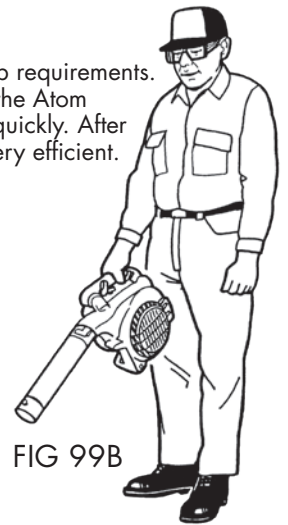

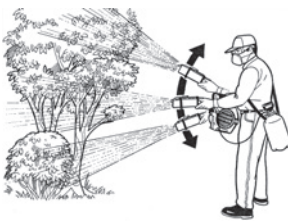

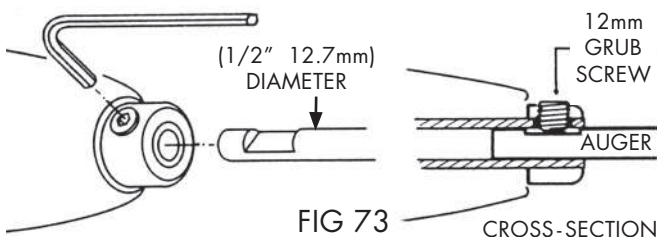

! WARNING As with any other power tool it is essential that you first make yourself familiar with all the safety precautions that have to be taken. Never take risks which could endanger yourself or others. You should strictly observe these simple rules:

DO NOT USE the Drill unit; unless you have proper balance, a firm and safe footing, a firm and steady grip on the clean and dry front handle and rear handle. Do not over-reach. If you do not have a firm grip and/or your feet are not securely placed in a firm position (eg. on slippery ground; in tree branches; on ladder, chair, makeshift platform; etc), injury can occur.

When using the Drill unit the front handle **must be used** and held firmly with your left hand, and **"CUPPED" RIGHT HAND UNDER REAR THROTTLE HANDLE.** (See Fig.60 on page 11). **If the engine stops while drilling do not restart with auger in hole as serious injury could occur.**

If drilling higher than your shoulder height above ground level, then you **must stand** only in a hydraulic bucket ("cherry picker"). Anything else, such as standing on ladders, tree branches, etc, is forbidden due to risk of injury. Fig. 74. Over-reaching is dangerous.

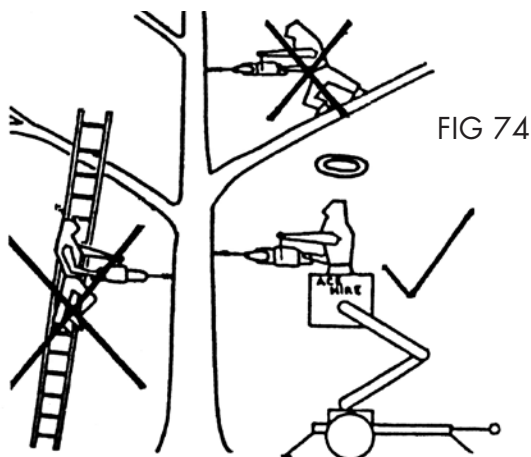

! WARNING Never touch an auger with your hand or any part of your body or clothes when the engine is running, even when the auger is not rotating. The auger continues to rotate for a short period after the throttle trigger is released until the automatic clutch disengages. The engine's idling speed must always be correctly adjusted, so that the auger does not rotate on idle.

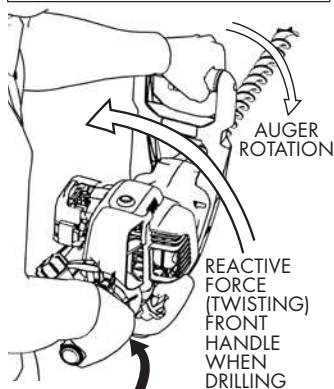
! SAFETY WARNING Check 7 handle screws #1-#7 are tight as in Figs 36 and 38 on page 6.

REACTIVE FORCES, TWISTING ACTION

Reactive (twisting) forces with the power drill may occur at any time the auger is rotating. **Reactive forces can be dangerous!** In any drilling machine, the powerful rotational torque used to drill wood works against the operator. See Fig.75 and 76. If the rotating auger is suddenly stopped by contact with any binding object like a wood knot, split, nail or cross hole, the reactive forces twisting the drill unit may occur instantly.

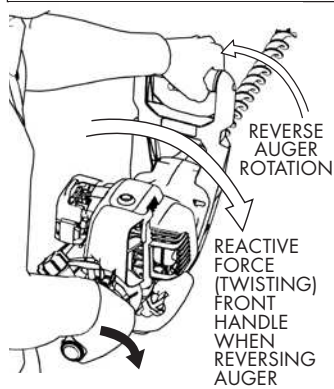
! WARNING These reactive twisting forces could result in loss of control of the drill unit. An understanding of the causes of these reactive (twisting) forces will help you avoid loss of control. The greater the force of the kickback reaction, the more difficult it may become for the operator to control the drill reactive force.

Start engine and allow to idle while locating the auger in position for drilling the hole. Push Engine Drill towards the wood and increase the power by rotating rear handle anti (counter) clockwise to drill the hole. For deep holes drill only 50 to 75mm (2-3") at a time and clear the auger frequently by pulling the drill back into reverse gear, thus preventing overloading of auger in the hole with wood chips.

! WARNING Whenever Drillmaster is put into reverse gear any re-active force DOES NOT activate safety throttle control to idle speed. Therefore, when reversing always be alert and have a firm grip on the unit.

To clear the hole or withdraw the auger, allow engine to slow down and pull attachment back towards you to engage reverse gear and then increase engine speed. This will unscrew the auger in an anticlockwise direction. The drill automatically changes back to clockwise rotation.

! NOTE The operator can stop or reduce the twisting of the Drill by firmly holding the Front handle with his left hand and twisting throttle control clockwise to the right with his right hand causing the engine speed to slow to idle thus stopping twisting of the drill and rotation of auger.

In an extreme situation when forward drilling and there is insufficient time to counteract the twisting force which will cause the drill to rotate suddenly to the left also will cause the rear hand held throttle to move to idle position thus stopping the rotation of the Drill unit. Pull unit carefully back into neutral increasing speed and pull back hard for Drill to engage reverse gear and the auger will un-screw out.

Recommence drilling and reversing to clear hole of wood chips and continue drilling.

! NOTE **DRILLMASTER** (including 4-Stroke Honda powered) can be used sideways (as shown in Fig.77), to reduce the handle reach when drilling at shoulder height. Any higher and you must use a hydraulic bucket as in Fig. 74.

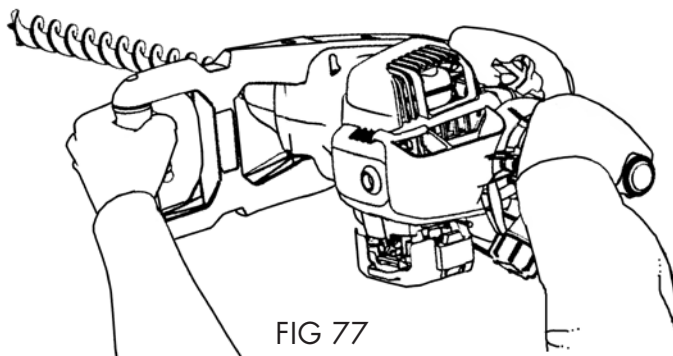

! NOTE **WOOD AUGERS** Atom Brand Wood Augers have double cutting front edges, better chip evacuation, excellent feed rate and easy sharpening. See page 21 for sizes and sharpening.

! SAFETY WARNING **Auger severely jams** in timber, stop engine, disconnect Drill from auger and remove auger with a Stillsons wrench. **If motor stops** while drilling for any reason then disconnect drill from Auger and remove Auger with Stillsons. Rectify reason for stoppage eg. ran out of fuel.

TRANSPORTING THE DRILL

! WARNING Always stop the engine before putting a Drill unit down or carrying it.

After levelling pre-work all surfaces to prepare the new flat bed. Use a rake to smooth out and tidy up.

The tiller can be transported by pushing it on its wheel.

Very hard ground, clay or rocky conditions: The Atom rotary tiller is NOT DESIGNED for very hard ground, hard or rocky conditions. These kinds of soil will not make a good garden bed. **WARNING:** When using air tools to remove nut, do not overtighten when refitting.

MAINTENANCE: AIRLIFT BLOWERS

1. Check oil level (4-Stroke) with dip stick #1. Also see page 10 Fig.50B.
2. Check regularly the air filter element as per instructions on page 19 #2.
3. Adjust idle speed screw for engine to always have fast idle speed (for easier starting).
4. Check all screws are tight on RH side of blower.
5. The internal three handle mounting springs can be checked with Torx20 screwdriver inserted into 3 handle recess holes #4.
6. Discard carefully any old fuel in tank if unit has not been used for three months or more #5. Refuel with fresh fuel.
 - For 4-Stroke engine use regular Petrol (no oil) and change sump oil every 50 hours and regularly check oil level.
 - For 2-Stroke engine use regular Petrol with 50 to 1 oil. See page 10.
7. Replace any broken or worn parts
8. Cruise control tension screw adjustment

If you have other service issues see pages 18 to 20 and consult your authorised Atom Dealer.

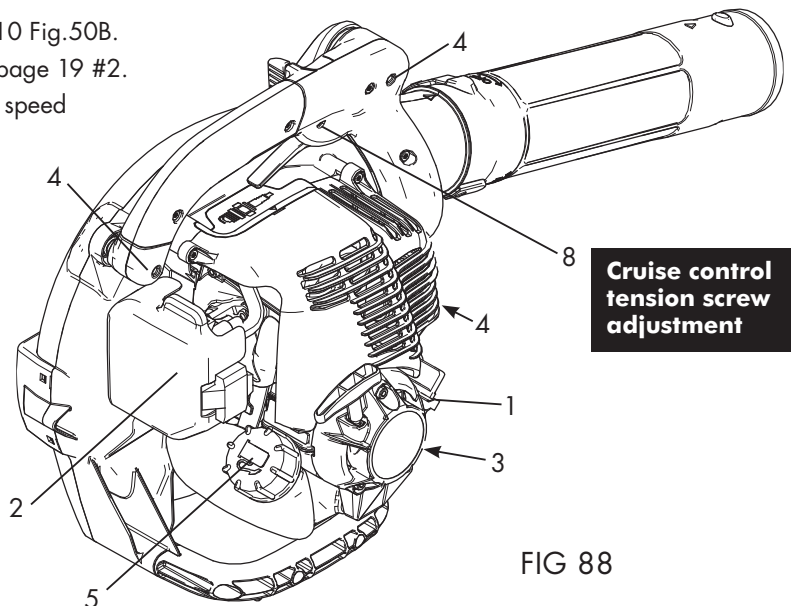

MAINTENANCE: DRILLMASTER ENGINE DRILLS

1. Depending on use, check all Torx25 screws around gear box (A), engine mount (B), Handles (C). Check various screws around recoil starter (D). Also check Torx20 screw (E) that locks throttle cable clamp.
2. Check after starting and warm up engine that idle speed does not turn auger. If adjustment required see page 19.
3. Check that ignition OFF SWITCH (E) turns motor off.
4. Ensure grub screw is tight on auger flat to prevent auger from loosening.
5. Add grease every 50 hours from grease bottle. Part No.43327. Minimum three squeezes. Fig. 90.

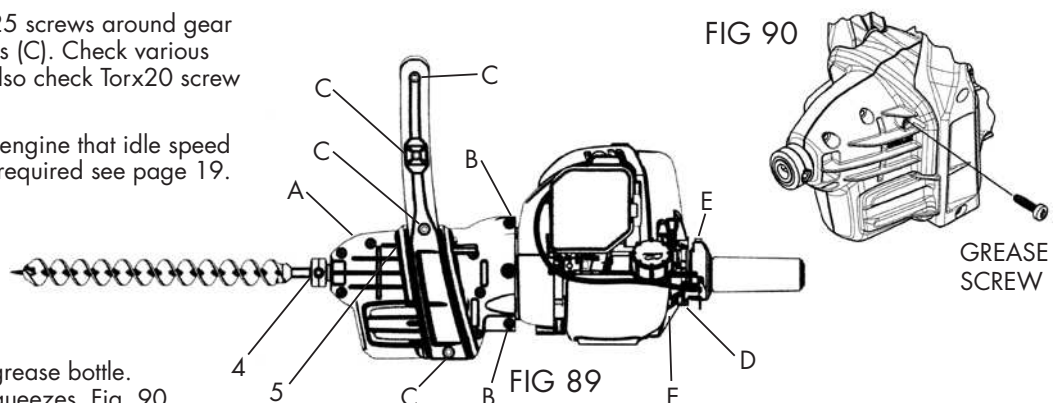

GREASE SCREW

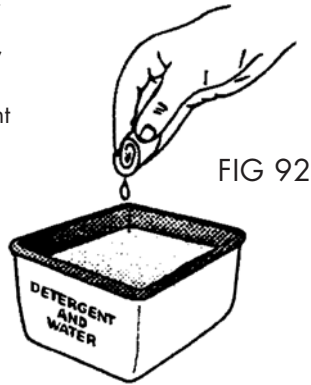
MAINTENANCE: ENGINES

AIR FILTER MAINTENANCE

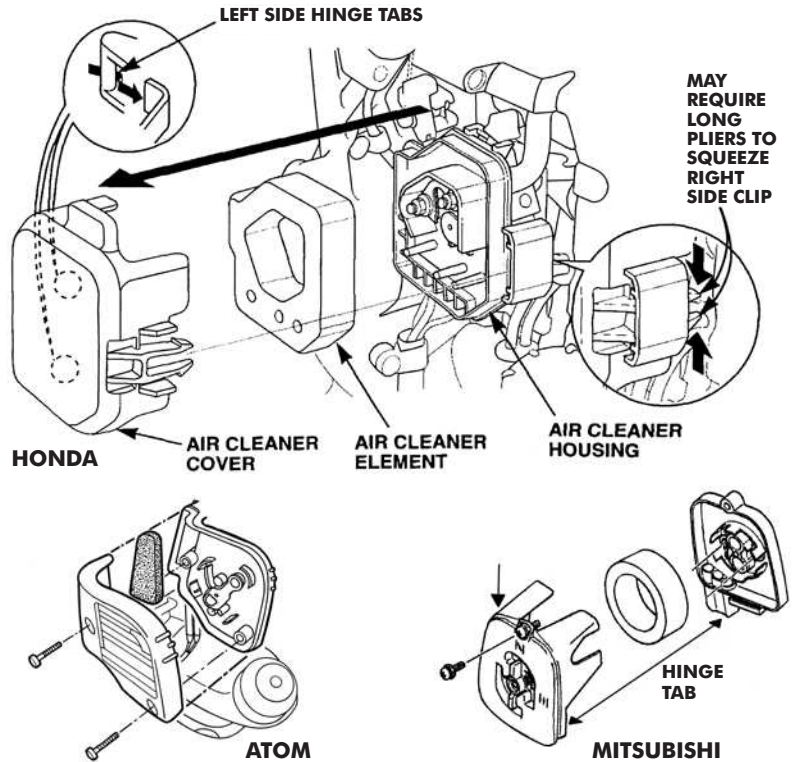
The air filter is one of the most important areas to maintain. If it is not maintained, engine will be damaged, also you will void the warranty. Before cleaning make sure the unit is turned off.

! NOTE Clean and re-oil the air filter every 10 hours of use. More frequently in dusty conditions. Eg. every 5 hours.

1. If filter is torn or very dirty, replace.
2. Wash the filter in detergent and water (Fig.92.) Rinse the filter thoroughly and allow to dry.
3. Apply enough clean engine oil or 2-Stroke oil to saturate the filter when squeezed. Squeeze the filter to spread the oil and to remove excess oil.



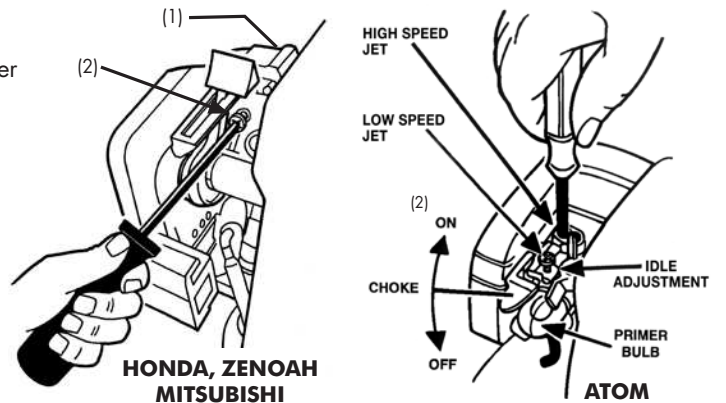
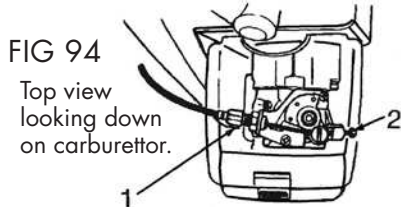
! NOTE If the unit is operated with dry or dirty filter or without the air filter and/or carburettor air filter cover, you will void the warranty.



ADJUSTING IDLE SPEED

The idling screw adjustment is accessible without removing the air filter cover. See Fig.94. To increase engine idle speed, turn IDLE SCREW (2) clockwise. To decrease engine speed, turn IDLE SCREW counter clockwise (anti-clockwise). Throttle trigger to be in idle position.

Cable adjustment can also be used to adjust idle.

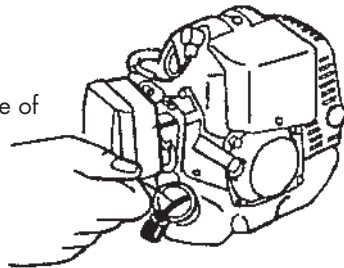


EDGERS, ENGINE DRILLS & TILLERS – Blades or Auger MUST NOT TURN.

BLOWERS – ALWAYS have FAST idle speed for easier starting.

FUEL FILTER MAINTENANCE

Hook out fuel filter with piece of bent wire. Blow clean with compressed air or replace.



ATOM ENGINES JET ADJUSTMENT

26FCS, 26FC-3, 26FC-4, 26FC-5 and 26HPE

- High speed approximately 1¼ turns
- Low speed approximately 1¼ turns

CHECKING THE SPARK PLUG

If engine is low on power, difficult to start or runs poorly at idling speed, check the spark plug.

- Allow engine to cool down. Remove spark plug.
- Clean dirty spark plug or replace with new spark plug.
- Check electrode gap 0.5mm (0.020")
- Rectify faults which have caused fouling of spark plug.

Possible faults include:

- Dirty air filter or fuel filter

- Unfavourable running conditions (eg. operating at part load)
- Too much oil or wrong type of oil in fuel tank in 2-Stroke engine.

Do not clean the spark plug in an abrasive grit spark plug cleaner, as expensive damage to the engine could occur through loose grit damaging chrome in cylinder bore.

Fit a new spark plug after approximately 50 operating hours or earlier if electrodes are badly eroded.

Check recommended spark plug is type or equivalent and specified electrode gap for each engine make.

TROUBLESHOOTING: AIRLIFT BLOWERS

There is very little to go wrong with your Atom Airlift Blower.

Follow all instructions including pages 18 and 19. These include:

1. Use good quality 2-Stroke 50/1 oil as 50:1 fuel mix in 2-Stroke engines ie. 20ml oil to 1 litre petrol or 80ml oil to 4 litres petrol.
2. SAE 10-30W non-synthetic mineral oil in 4-Stroke engines.
3. Clean and oil air filter regularly depending on use.
4. If storing unit for 3 months or more, drain fuel from tank, restart motor to use residual fuel in carburettor.
5. Follow regular maintenance chart. Page 18.
6. Starting and idling are covered on Page 19. If well used Honda engine is harder to start, check o-ring on manifold for o-ring replacement.

7. **Starting difficulties could occur when the idle speed is not fast. After much use idle speed can drop back. Keep fast idle speed for easy starting.**
8. If Atom engine powered blower does not achieve full RPM, check that choke is full off and that carby is full on when throttle trigger is pulled fully up. If necessary adjust throttle cable for full throttle. Otherwise adjust carby jet.
9. If Honda engine powered blower does not achieve full power, check that choke is fully open and that carby is full on when throttle trigger is pulled fully up. Otherwise adjust throttle cable.

SHARPENING WOOD AUGERS

The best hardwood auger is the Atom chisel tip auger with 4 cutting edges (ie 2 longitudinal cutting edges and 2 radial cutting edges).

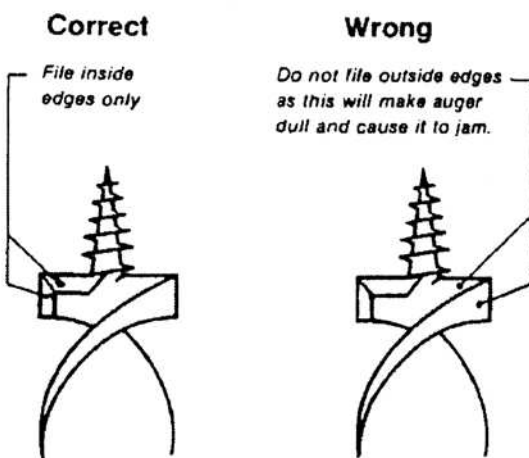
SHARPENING ATOM AUGERS WITH ROUNDED EDGES

Use a small half round file or 3/16 Round file. Carefully file inside the shaped curve of the cutting edges.

If correctly sharpened, the cutting edges will be as sharp as saw chain teeth. Once they become dull they should be resharpened as described.

Never file the outer edges of the auger.

Our goods come with guarantees that cannot be excluded under the Australian Consumer Law. You are entitled to a replacement or refund for a major failure and you are also entitled to have the goods repaired if the goods fail to be acceptable quality and the failure does not amount to a major failure. The Atom Warranty is additional to the conditions and warranties which are mandatorily implied by the laws and regulations of the individual States and Territories of Australia and the Australian Consumer Law; the Consumer Guarantees Act in New Zealand; and any non-excludable laws.

Limitations of Warranty

Warranty applies to the original purchaser only. Proof of purchase date must be provided with the original sales docket prior to any warranty work. This is also proof that the unit is not a stolen unit.

Does not cover excessive overheating of clutch because operator neglected OPERATIONAL INSTRUCTION **and did not have blades spinning rapidly with motor speed at full throttle** and/or blades were digging in deeper than 10mm to 15mm into soil due to incorrect wheel height adjustment **thus causing blades not to spin rapidly causing clutch to continuously slip and overheat**. Blades on lawn edgers are not covered by the warranty.

GARDEN TILLER WARRANTY

Does not cover gear box damage or lack of adding grease every 5 hours as described in the operator manual.

ALL ATOM POWERED EQUIPMENT

- Use of parts by the buyer/owner other than genuine Atom spare parts (eg edger blades) and problems with the machine caused by the use of any other non-genuine parts, cancels the Warranty.
- Altering the product in any way cancels the Warranty.
- Any Atom gasoline product run with incorrect fuel, oil or oil level, is not covered by the Warranty.
- Failure to properly service cooling or air filtration systems cancels the Warranty.
- Failure to follow the instruction manual, instructions tags or instruction labels attached to the product, cancels the Warranty.
- Damage from an accident; misuse, neglect, dropping the unit or dropping anything on the unit, is not covered by the Warranty.
- Blades, filters and spark plugs are not covered by Warranty.
- Fair wear and tear and normal wear are not covered by the Warranty. Engines, like all mechanical devices, need periodic parts service and replacement to perform well. Warranty will not cover repair when normal use has exhausted the life of a part or an engine or machine. Warranty will not apply if the engine damage occurred because of misuse, lack of routine maintenance, shipping, handling, warehousing or improper installation. Similarly, warranty is void if the serial number of the engine or product has been removed or by using contaminated lubricating oil, or an incorrect grade of lubricating oil. For four stroke engines, check oil and refill when necessary, and change at recommended intervals. Two stroke engines must use the recommended fuel/oil ratio as prescribed in the manual that is supplied with the product. Spillage of fuel over engine parts creating blocked air filters is not considered warranty.
- Repair or adjustment of associated parts or assemblies such as throttle cables and switches are not covered by the Warranty.
- Damage or wear to parts caused by dirt, which entered the engine because of improper air cleaner maintenance, reassembly, or use of a non-original air cleaner element or cartridge are not covered by the Warranty. At recommended intervals, clean and/or replace the filter as stated in the Operator's Manual.
- The warranty also does not extend to repairs required because of:
 - a) Leaking carburetors, clogged fuel pipes, sticking valves, or other damage, caused by using contaminated and/or stale fuel/oil.
 - b) Parts which are scored or broken because an engine was operated with insufficient lubrication or other abuse in operation.
 - c) Requirement for a routine tune-up or adjustment of the engine.
 - d) Engine or engine component failure, ie, combustion chamber, valves, valve seats, valve guides, caused by the use of inferior gasolines, wrong oils in 4 stroke engines or incorrect gasolines and oils used in two stroke mixtures.
 - e) Service parts not replaced at the appropriate time according to the maintenance schedule.

Nothing in these terms shall exclude, restrict or modify any term, condition, warranty or liability implied into this contract by statute, where to do so would be unlawful or would render any provision of this contract void. - The Customer is required to transport the Atom product to and from the Authorised Service Dealer at the expense of the Customer.

- Before dealer commences repair they will contact Atom by phone for any genuine warranty claim. Atom will despatch parts, whether factory assembled modules or individual parts, as per warranty period and conditions.

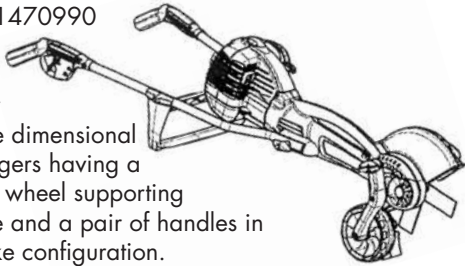

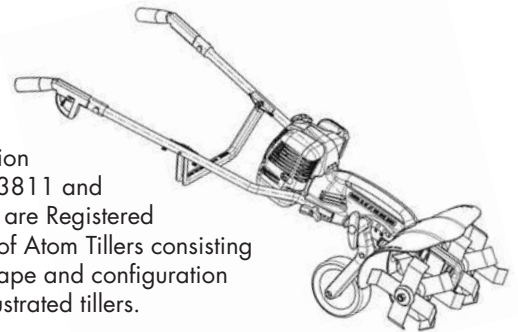
